David j Taylor (or "djt" is he is often called) has had many accomplishments in his over 18 years working in the Music and Film Industries. He is an Award Winning (past WMCA Producer of the Year Winner) and Multiple Award Nominated Record Producer/Engineer/Mixer/Musician and Arranger with over 80 album production credits to his name 1993-2010 (Smokekiller, Geoff Berner, Despistado, Sylvie, Meghan Bowman, Ultimate Power Duo).

David is also an accomplished Songwriter/Recording/Touring Artist himself, having released 15 albums (with "Big Cookie", "Dollar Store Mary", "Generals and Majors" and as

a solo artist) with #15 released Sept 18th 2010 (The LP "Heartaches and Numbers" by "Semko, Fonatine, Taylor", featuring David alongside fellow singer/songwriter's Kim Fontaine and Northern Pikes front-man Jay Semko).

In the audio post production world David (alongside fellow Twisted Pair Productions engineers Cary Ciesielski and Luc Hart) is a current 2010 Gemini Award Nominee for Best Sound in a Documentary Program for 291 Films' "Saskatchewan River Delta" Documentary film (winner announced November 2010) and has, in the past been awarded/nominated (Gemini/Showcase) for his work as a Music Supervisor (renegadepress.com 1-5, numerous TV Ads), Re-Recording Mixer for TV/Film (Landscape as Muse, The Bionic Bannock Boys), Foley Recordist/Artist (Corner Gas 1-6, The Englishman's Boy).

He has also acted as a Voice-Over Artist and Composer/Jingle Writer for various TV and Radio Ad Campaigns. David has spoken at numerous music industry events over the years (WCMA, PMW, SXSW) and has been a guest lecturer for The University of Saskatchewan, The University of Regina and SaskMusic. David and close friends Fontaine and Semko instruct the Annual U of S Emma Lake Songwriting retreat at The Kenderdine Campus in Northern Saskatchewan.

David and his partner own a 20acre horse farm/project studio at Milestone SK (Hazelwood Farm) where Russ raises and trains world caliber show horses and David makes his music "as loudly as he wants to/whenever he wants to" in the peace and quiet of the country.

David has worked full time for Twisted Pair Productions in Regina SK since late 2008; Regina's Premier Recording Studio/Production Facility where David uses most of the above skills during any given work week.
